HERMAN B. TAYLOR was born on October 18, 1938 in Baltimore, Maryland to the late William and Geneva Taylor. He departed this life on July 3, 2023, at Gilchrist Hospice.

He attended Douglas High School and was a proud graduate of Morgan State University.

On June 9, 1963, Herman married Sarah Elizabeth Raines of Virginia. The couple established Town and Country Nursery School, the first black owned business in Chesterfield County, Virginia in 1971. Sarah passed away in 1990, however he continued to run the center until the business was sold in 1998.

Herman retired and returned to Baltimore to take care of his mother until she passed way in 2009.

Herman joined Rising Son First Baptist Church on September 27, 2009, with Christian experience. He served as a member of the male chorus and faithfully attended church services until his health began to fail.

Herman leaves to cherish his memory: his son, Rodney Taylor; daughter-in-law, Caroline Taylor; grandson, Jonathan "Jonny" Taylor; and a host of loving family and friends.
