



Hilton Ernest Randall

September 12, 1944 - September 7, 2003

On September 12, 1944, HILTON ERNEST RANDALL, JR., son of Hilton and Elizabeth Randall, made his entrance onto the Stage of Life, Baltimore, Maryland. Hilton was affectionately known as “Butch” and “Butchie”. He departed this life on September 7, 2003 after battling brain cancer for ten months. Raised in a Christian environment, he received his early religious training at St. Matthews Methodist Church in Turner Station. His most recent church affiliation was with Canaan Baptist Church in New York City. He received his early education at Fleming Elementary School and at Sollers Point Junior Senior High School in Turner Station. After graduation, he enlisted in the U.S. Air Force. Following his honorable discharge, Hilton moved to New York City. There he received his Bachelor of Arts Degree from the City College of New York and later, a Master of Social Work from Fordham University in New York. Upon completion of his formal education, Hilton was employed as follows: Unit Director at Steinway Child and Family Services (1979-82); External Consultant for the New York City Department of Health (1987-89); Senior Clinical Supervisor at the Upper Manhattan Mental Health Center, Inc. (1982-2000); and a Guidance Counselor for two elementary schools in New York City (2000-01). Concurrently, Hilton pursued private practice as a psychotherapist from 1981 until his illness. Butch was a private person, but the friends he had were true and dear. He enjoyed jogging, swimming, boxing, and singing and dancing to old 60's music. For several years Hilton was the emcee for citywide talent shows that he coordinated. He

was humorous, without trying to be, and a counselor at all times. Upon realizing how weak he had become, Hilton decided to return to Baltimore. The family brought him home. Almost a month later, he transitioned from this life and entered the stage of Eternal Life. He leaves to celebrate the memory of his life: his father, Hilton E. Randall Sr., mother, Elizabeth Randall Washington; three sisters, Julia Davidson-Randall, Dorothy C. Randall and Gwendolyn Chaney; one brother, David R. Randall Sr.; a stepmother, Mary Randall; one brother-in-law, Eddie Chaney; nieces and nephews, David Jr., Jackie, Wendy, Eddie Jr., Danane, Damon, Dezire, Shardae, David III, Diamond, Jade and Chamberlain; a special friend, Melinda Schroeder, and other relatives and friends.
