March 24, 1929 - February 16, 2002

Hooper Wylie, son of the late George and Eunice Wylie, was born on March 24, 1929 in Fairfield County, South Carolina. He departed this life on February 16, 2002 after a lengthy illness. He received his education in the public schools of South Carolina until 1939. The family relocated to Baltimore, Maryland, where he continued his education at Dunbar High School until 1945. The National Can Corporation from 1945 employed him until his retirement in 1975. While employed at National Can, Hooper was called to serve in the United States Army. He received basic training in Ft. Benning, Georgia and was then transferred to Korea to serve in the Korean War. He served in the Armed Forces from 1951 until 1953, when he was discharged. Hooper met and married his late wife, Barbara Wylie and from this union four children were born: Tyrone, Jacqueline, Herbert and Michael, all of whom preceded him in death. In 1980, he joined the Eastside Baptist Church and has served on the Trustee Board since 1982. In 1999, he married the former Mamie Jefferson, who loved and diligently cared for him until his death. Hooper, affectionately known as Herbert, was a man who was loved and respected by everyone who knew him. Although quiet in nature, he had a positive impact on the many people whose lives he has touched throughout the years. He leaves to cherish his memory: his wife, Mamie Wylie; one brother, Leroy Wylie; granddaughter, Jacquetta Parker; two great-grandson, Gregory and Willie; two stepdaughters, Debbie and Vickie; six step-grandchildren, a host of nieces, nephews, relatives and close friends.
