The late Edna Campbell planted the seed by taking him to Sunday School and at the age of seven he joined the Providence Baptist Church and was baptized. He joined the United States Army at an early age and later received an honorable discharge. As a diligent servant and member of Providence Baptist Church for over 70 years Howard Marshall served on the Usher Board, Finance Board, and as a Boy Scouts Leader until his health failed him after a fall in February of 2004. For over fifty years, he was a member of the Mason Eden Lodge #72 and this quiet, well groomed young man became a business proprietor owning an 18 wheel truck and a Texaco gas station. After several years in business for himself, he sold the business. The last 18 years in the workforce he was a longshoreman until retiring in 1990. In 1983, he married Rev. Betty Anderson who brought one son to this union, Demetrius Mims, who preceded him in death. To this union there were no biological children born; however, they loved and raised two granddaughters, Detris and Cornelya Mims. He affectionately called them Bandit and Grabble Girty. Howard was fondly called by several names: Mike, Marshall, Past Master Marshall, Leonard and Cabbage Head. In the years that he and Betty shared together he affectionately called her Babe or Sweet Babe. Marshall loved to

travel and they loved traveling together. They traveled to Aruba,, New Orleans, Detroit, Cleveland, Kentucky, Chicago, Atlanta and several cruises to the Caribbean.
