April 15, 1930 - November 25, 2016

Howard Theodore Pegram, affectionately known as "Piggy" to family and friends, was born on April 15, 1930 to the late Alexander and Marie Pegram in Baltimore, Maryland. He departed this life on November 25, 2016.

Howard grew up in a wonderful and loving household with his parents and younger sister, Bernice (deceased). The Pegram's had an open door policy. At various points in his childhood, Howard's immediate family expanded to include other family and friends. He attended Baltimore City Public Schools, graduating from Paul Laurence High School in June of 1949. Howard was employed by the now defunct Bethlehem Steel Corporation at Sparrows Point. He worked there for over 35 years. He retired from the tin mill in the early 1990 when new technology replaced old manufacturing methods.

Howard was raised as a young boy in Faith Baptist Church. He joined Mt. Ararat Baptist Church when he married Etta, a member from the church's original Canton location. He remained a member of Mt. Ararat for over 60 years.

Howard enjoyed hanging with the "fellas". In the 1970's you could find him at Memorial Stadium cheering on the Baltimore Colts. Since the departure of the Colts, he became a fair weather fan of the home sports teams. Howard loved to eat, and could make the worst cook feel good by cleaning his plate, except when it came to red meat. He had to have his steak well done. At a celebration dinner, a chef came from the kitchen to see the person who wanted to ruin a beautiful cut of meat. The chef refused to prepare Howard's steak well done.

Howard married the love of his life, Etta in 1955. They honeymooned in Atlantic City where they returned yearly to celebrate Etta's birthday. The couple had one child, Tamara. When Howard's health failed, Etta provided meticulous care for her husband, fulfilling his wish to die peacefully at home with her by his side.

Howard leaves not to mourn, but to cherish sweet memories: his devoted wife Etta.
