HOWARD L. WARREN SR. was born on September 26, 1943, to William H. Warren and the late Elizabeth H. Warren. Howard was the second youngest of four siblings; one preceded him in death, Shirley Webb, known as “Aunt Clem.” Howard was known as a very obedient child who grew up displaying great love for his family. On any given day, you could find him being with his mom following her around, and assisting her in any way he could, especially in the kitchen. His favorite dish was fried chicken and he passionately referred to it as the “Barnyard Pimp.” Howard was educated in the Baltimore City Public School System. From school, he worked many jobs, and could be described as a hard worker until he established his career as a truck driver for Smelkinson Sysco Food Company. He loved to work with his hands, and was an excellent painter. He retired after 30 years, and began working alongside his late wife, Joyce, to establish their family legacy in the form of a group home for adolescent girls and teen moms. Howard met the love of his life, his teenage sweetheart, the late Joyce Warren. They were united in holy matrimony on November 15, 1965, and remained 43 years until her untimely death. Their home was always known as the place to be, for a loving and fun atmosphere, full of great music and tasty food. Together they had four children: the late Wanda Rogers, Howard L. Warren Jr., Cheryl Warren-Bryant, and Doneisha Warren. “Pops” as he was affectionately called, was always a great provider for his family. He was a supportive husband who loved his wife, and a great father who loved telling stories from the days of old, and providing structure for his children. Pops first gave his life to the Lord at Rock of Ages Pentecostal Church under the leadership of the late Pastor Richard Phillips. There he developed life-long friendships, that helped him grow in his personal walk with the Father. In sitting and talking with him on any given day, he made it known that he loved the Lord. He leaves to celebrate his life: his son, Howard L. Warren Jr. (Gloria); two daughters, Cheryl Warren-Bryant and Doneisha Warren; four wonderful granddaughters that adored him and shared in a special bond, Joy Rogers, Bazchaun Rogers, Kayla and Kierra Warren; six grandsons, Tremaine Warren, Davon Mason, Howard Warren III, Shawn Warren, Tre’Shawn Warren, and Darrius Warren; father, William H.
