The Life of Ida Williams Fields

Ida Williams Fields, was born to two loving parents, Albert L. Williams, Sr. and Constance Jones Williams (Spurlock) on October 17, 1939. She departed this life March 30, 2019.

Ida grew up in Providence Park, a closely-knit neighborhood that was warm and nurturing. Prior to high school, she was an active member in her family church, First African Baptist. After attending high school at Pine Forge Institute, she decided to become a Seventh-Day Adventist. Ephesus and Meadowbridge Seventh-Day Adventist Churches were blessed with her strong leadership skills, straight forwardness, dedication, and love for her church family.
