



## Ida Inez Chapman

October 4, 1920 - November 24, 2005

Ida Inez Chapman was born the youngest girl of seven children on October 4, 1920 in Ayden, North Carolina, to the late Henry and Sarah Elizabeth Shields. She attended and graduated from the Ayden Public School System in 1938. She accomplished graduating from High School, though she never owned a book. She so passionately craved an education that she would wait until more fortunate students would finish their studies and use their books to study at night. Later, Ida moved north to Baltimore, Maryland and earned enough money to stop her mother from working under harsh conditions as a domestic worker. There she met and married in 1954 the late Nathan Chapman, Sr., and through this union, one beloved son was born, Nathan Jr. She accepted Christ as her personal Savior at an early age and was a member of First Baptist Church Guildford for many years, then after relocating to Ellicott City, she joined Bethel Baptist Church. "Sister" or "Inez" as she was fondly called by friends and relatives, worked as a seamstress for over 20 years until her retirement. During her retirement, she found pleasure spending time with the other tenants at Parkview at Ellicott City and her friends at The Baines Center. In later years her greatest enjoyment and time spent was with her three granddaughters. Ida Inez Chapman departed this life on Thursday, November 24, 2005, at the University of Maryland Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland after a sudden illness. Inez leaves to cherish her memory: her son, Nathan A. Chapman, Jr.; three granddaughters, Taylor, Jordan and Jillian; one sister, Edwina Revell; a daughter-in-law, Valerie Chapman; and a host of nieces,

nephews, cousins, other relatives and friends.
