INELL BOOKER, daughter of the late Charlie and Woodie McClendon, was born March 26, 1930, in Wilkes County, GA. She was the seventh of ten children. Inell departed her life on the 23rd day of August 2006, succumbing to her battle with breast cancer. Inell had ten siblings, Lola Mae, Willy T., Lawrence, Charlie Roberts, Johnny Bunch, Claude Allen, Paul, Marion and Samuel McClendon. Inell attended both Trinity Elementary School and Washington High School. After relocating to Baltimore, MD, she continued her education by attending the physical therapy nursing program at City Hospital (now Johns Hopkins Bayview). In 1946 she wed Roosevelt Booker, Sr., and out of the union seven children was born: Novella Gatling, Roosevelt, Jr., preceded her in death, Charles Allen, Melvin, L. Kenneth, David and Gregory Booker preceded her in death. Their family continued to grow with the birth of thirty grandchildren and forty great grandchildren. Inell studied with Jehovah's Witnesses and in 1951 dedicated her life to Jehovah. She was a member of the Carroll Park Congregation, but spent the last years with the Park Heights Congregation where she continued devoting her life to Jehovah God. She leaves to mourn: her five living children, Novella Gatling, Allen, Melvin, Kenneth and David Booker; one sister, Lola Davis; one brother, Samuel McClendon; four sisters-in-law, Gladys Graves and Johnny Mae Booker both of Washington, GA, Patricia Booker, Leatha Green both of Baltimore, MD; four daughters-in-law, Ellie, Deborah, Janice and Jackie Booker; two dear friends, Mollie Garnier, preceded her in death and Mary Cooley; former daughter-in-

law, Laurice booker; thirty grandchildren, forty great-grandchildren, aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews and a host of other relatives and spiritual friends.
