INEZ ALICE CHAPPELL, born on February 8, 1925 in Baltimore City, she was sister to seven siblings: Elmer, Dorothy, O'Donald, Horace, Meredith, Nellie and Arron.

The daughter of George and Ida Mae Chappell, Inez was raised in West Baltimore and lived in the Harlem Park area of the city. She attended Baltimore City Schools, one of which being Cortez Peters, with aspiration of being involved in the business community.

Inez was well known for being The Manicurist in barbershop on Pennsylvania Avenue during its "hay day" in the 40's and 50's. She enlisted clients such as Boxer Joe Louis, Comedian Flip Wilson, Singer Nat King Cole and a host of other sports players and entertainers.

Although Inez spent a quarter of a century on "The Avenue", her love in life was horse racing.

Inez was well known in the most prestigious circles of racing in the state of Maryland.

The Afro-American Newspaper often referred to Inez as the Racing Africjonado. She sponsored a yearly dinner at Pimlico race Track honoring

African Americans in Horse Racing and was listed in American's "Who's Who" for Horse Racing Personalities.

Inez departed this life on November 2, 2011 at Northwest Hospital. She leaves to cherish her memory: one nephew, Meredith Chappell; three nieces, Barbara Dunlap, Patsy Chappell and Karen Young and a host of great nieces and nephews.
