She was always known as a homebody and noted for her down home cooking, especially those hot rolls and sweet potato pies. She worked diligently in her church until her health began to fail, but this did not stop her from serving her Lord. Most of the time when you entered her home, you would hear the songs of ZION and words of PRAISE coming from her radio. She often called her friends to share the GOODNESS of the MASTER. She strongly believed that with GOD all things were possible. She was the mother of the late Milton R. Dudley, the late George E. Bailey and one surviving son Charles Doughty, Sr. She raised her

children with a iron hand, but followed it with a gentle pat. She babysat and helped to raise so many other children that she was fondly called MOM by a lot of people. Honesty, respect, love truthfulness and courtesy were her mottos. She leaves to mourn their loss, one son, Charles Doughty, Sr.; one daughter-in-law, Margaret E. Doughty; three granddaughters, Irene P. Montaque, Elizabeth A. McCain and Charlene E.
