In 1968, led by the Holy Ghost, she joined the First Apostolic Faith Church with her husband Randolph under the pastoral leadership of Bishop Winfield A. Showell and continued under Apostle Cornelius Showell. There she served faithfully as a member of the Communion Committee until illness prevented her from serving.
