Irma Carter Cobb, of Richmond, Virginia was born on October 8, 1916. She was called home to be with her heavenly father to rest on May 12, 2005. She is preceded in death by her mother Maude Gould Carter and her father: two sisters, Georgia May Smith and Gladys Smith. She attended the Richmond Public School System and later moved to New York City to attend Girl's High. Irma was a member of St. Paul's Baptist Church in Brooklyn, New York. She married her childhood sweetheart, Joseph Cobb and from this union had two children, Joseph and Gladys. She became a widow in 1950. Her employment spanned from Preston Recording and Gulf Western Electronics. She was the first Black woman inspector of wiring for many government plants in New Jersey. She was truly a woman on a mission by being involved as a labor leader, shop steward with labor relations and participated in several marches, such as March on Washington with Martin Luther King, Jr. She enjoyed dancing, crossword puzzles, her family and always polite to everyone. Irma often would make someone smile and say, "how's my baby" and, if someone asked her how she felt, she would say 'most spacious.' Bereaved by our loss, but uplifted by her homegoing celebration our memories will remain: son, Joseph (Marion) Carter; daughter, Neblett, Deirdre Johnson and Karen and Darion Carter; 26 great grandchildren; 12 great-grands; and other relatives and friend, who Irma loved dearly.
