Isaac Hampton was born in Charles City County, Virginia and was affectionately known as "Jack." He was the youngest along with his twin sister of seven children. Jack received his education in Charles City County schools. After graduating from high school, Jack joined the United States Army where he served for 2 years. After an honorable discharge, he was employed with the United State Postal Service in Richmond, Virginia serving until he retired after 32 years of service.

Jack was preceded in death by his parents, Frank Oliver and Anna Rebecca Hampton, his three brothers Wardell, Will and Lindsay Hampton; sisters Beatrice Quick and Rosalene Cotman, and his twin sister Irene Peticolas.
