Isabelle Anna Clark started her journey May 31, 1924. Isabelle was educated in the Richmond Public School System, graduating from Armstrong High School in 1941. She pursued her higher education at St. Phillips School of Nursing that was established in 1920 to educate black women to care for blacks during segregation. She furthered her education when the blacks were allowed to participate in MCV's School of Nursing when it was desegregated in 1957. The extra training in pharmacology allowed her to be able to pass medications to patients. She retired from MCV after working 30 years. She was a volunteer at the Virginia Food Bank for 20 years. Isabelle was a faithful member of Good Shepherd Baptist Church until her health began to fail.

Isabelle Anna Clark was preceded in death by her husband, Jerry Clark and one daughter, Geraldine Williams, her parents and one brother. She leaves to cherish precious memories, a devoted daughter, Jean Robinson (Howard); three grandsons; James C. Williams, III; Howard T. Robinson, III and Corey D. Williams, six great grandchildren and one sister; Joyce A. Byrd (Prentice), one niece and one nephew, two brothers-in-law, four sisters-in-law and extended family and friends.
