Mother Isabelle Scofield, affectionately known by many as “Belle,” was born on April 27, 1930 in Baltimore, Maryland to the late Laura Newman and William Herndon. She peacefully departed this life on Saturday, November 10, 2012, at the age of 82. Isabelle was educated in the Baltimore Public School System.

Mother Scofield was the wife of the late Bishop Samuel Scofield, and out of this union, three children were born. She also had five children from a previous marriage. Mother Scofield was a loving wife and mother and always took care of her children and grandchildren. She also nurtured the neighborhood children as her children as well.

Mother Scofield served faithfully under the leadership of the late Bishop William S. Barnes, Sr. at the St. Paul Apostolic Church of God in Baltimore, Maryland. She was baptized in Jesus Name and filled with the precious gift of the Holy Ghost. Mother Scofield held various positions in the church: head of the kitchen committee, Sunday School teacher for the Cradle Roll class, choir member and a member of the women’s auxiliary. Mother Scofield had many favorite songs, namely: One Day, Nobody but you, Lord, If it had not been for the Lord on my side, Everyday with Jesus, Something on the Inside, Give Him the Glory and Give Him the Praise. She was a true worshipper of Christ and would let nothing or no one keep her from serving her God.
