Isaiah Brown, son of the late Isaiah and Lena Jenkins-Brown, was born on January 24, 1930. He was the sixth of seven children. After a lengthy illness and courageous battle he departed this life on April 12, 2012. He was affectionately called “June” by his family and “Ike” by his friends.

Isaiah was educated in the Baltimore Public School System. He was employed as a Welder by Coastal Manufacturing Company until his retirement. He was not content with retirement and felt the need to return to work. He was employed at Harbor Court Hotel and later at Pimlico Racetrack until he was seventy-five years old and had to stop due to declining health. In the early years he attended Saint Francis Xavier Catholic Church.

Isaiah married Barbara Wilson in 1987. His first marriage ended in divorce.

He enjoyed reading and music and was an avid sports fan. He seldom missed the Ravens and Orioles games on television, after game parties and cook-outs. He also enjoyed traveling in the past, but never stopped socializing with friends at Old Town Mall, some he had known for a lifetime. He was always a true and generous friend and a devoted family man.

Isaiah leaves to cherish his memory: his devoted wife, Barbara Brown; one faithful sister, Doris Berrain; one grandson, Willie Perry, Jr. of Reading,

Pennsylvania; a sister-in-law, Sonja Wilson; (his daughter, Florence Perry and son-in-law, Willie Perry, Sr. preceded him in death); he also leaves nieces, nephews, and a host of friends.
