August 10, 1921 - June 7, 2004

Isaiah Cotton, son of the late Isaiah Parker Cotton and the late Mary Cotton Herring, was born August 10, 1921 in Pinetops, North Carolina and departed this life on June 2004. Isaiah, or "Shank" as many of his friends knew him, met Louvenia Gorham in December 1941 at a Christmas party at the home of his cousin, Mark. His mother told him "there was a cute little girl over there"- he had a 1934 Ford-she liked the car-and after a five year courtship, they were married February 20, 1946. From their marriage came two children, Betty Cotton Landrum and now deceased, Isaiah Parker Cotton. Isaiah worked at the Bethlehem Steel Company for 35+years. He was a World War II veteran serving in Europe and received a Bronze Star for bravery in combat. Isaiah was not only a loving husband and father, but also a loving grand and great-grandfather.
