Ivan Douglas Barney, son of the late James and Viola Barney, was born on October 19, 1930, in Newark, New Jersey.

Late Friday evening, March 11, 2011, the Lord called Ivan home to rest.

Ivan received his education in Newark, New Jersey and was a graduate of the first graduating class of Sollers Point High School in Turners Station, Maryland. He attended Morgan College, now known as Morgan State University, where he played football.
