Jack Bryant, beloved seventh child of Sandy Mack and Pearl (Riley) Bryant, was born to this life on October 20, 1944, in Ford City, Pennsylvania. He accepted Christ at an early age and had his Christian rearing at Second Baptist Church in Ford City. As a young man, Jack could often be found helping his father, who was Chairman of the Deacon Board, with many of the church related activities. This activity was something that Jack enjoyed and helped to develop his strong character. Jack was a graduate of Ford City High School and the Allegheny Technical Institute in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, where he received a technical certificate in Electronics. After receiving this certificate, Jack relocated to Baltimore, Maryland to begin a highly successful thirty-eight year career with Westinghouse Corporation and Northrop Grumman Corporation. At the time of his death, Jack was Manager in the Electronic Systems Division. He was highly regarded by all for his "can-do" attitude. On June 24, 1978, Jack was united in holy matrimony to Joanne Brown, and became a devoted father to Kenneth. In his later years, Jack was in fellowship with his wife at Heritage United Church of Christ and at Emmarts United Methodist Church. Early on Friday, April 30, 2004, Jack was called home to glory.
