He received his education at Fosdick-Masten High School and State University of Buffalo in Buffalo, New York. He served in the United States Army from 1945 through 1947 and was honorably discharged having received the "Army of Occupation Medal" and the "World War II Victory Medal." He later worked as a traffic economist for such companies as National Traffic Service, Boss-Linco, Inc. and Roadway, Inc. He retired from Hunt-Wesson (Conagara). He married the former Shirley Wright, and out of this union seven children were born, Steven, Geoffrey, Jocelyn, Jacquelyn, Lori, Lynne and Lisa Paris. Jack was a jazz enthusiast and spent most of his adult life in California, where he loved the ocean. He was former president of the West Coast Shippers Association. 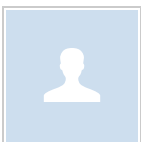
