Jacob Chijaiago Ukandu, son of late Chief Ukandu Oriaku and late Ezinne (LoLo) Omeonunwa Ukandu Oriaku was born around November 29, 1930. He departed this life on February 13, 2004. "JC," as most people called him during his youth days, did not receive any formal education because his parents died when he was a very young child. Although he was a very smart person, he did not have the financial support to attend school. His sister took him in. They were very poor. After a while, he decided to go to the city to learn a trade. He chose to live in Kano City, Nigeria, where he established a small business. Jacob was the past Executive President of Ubakala Improvement Union, Federated, Kano Branch, from 1960 until 1966. His reign was interrupted by the Civil War. He returned to his native home in Ubakala, Nigeria to become a farmer. He returned to Kano City in the 70's to reestablish another small business. He was elected Treasurer General of Ubakala Improvement Union-Kano Branch until 1981, when his children requested for him to retire and return to the village. He gracefully accepted. He was elected President and Treasurer for life of Umuejeayor community due to his leadership and trustworthiness. Papa made education as a priority for all his children. He felt very strongly about education and made many sacrifices for this purpose. Even when his efforts paid off, he was still low keyed. In 1988, which was his first visit to the United States, he spent about nine months with his children in Baltimore. Papa was very proud of and happy with his children, daughters-in-law and grandchildren. He was a likeable person with strong

convictions. Papa will be sincerely missed by everyone who knew him.
