Jacquelyn Leslie Hall Barham, daughter of the late Walter Stockett Hall and Ethel Fayerweather Hall, the youngest of 3 children, was born on September 4, 1922 in Providence, Rhode Island. Jackie as she was often called, received her education in the Providence, Rhode Island school system. After graduation she attended and graduated from Johnson and Wales Business School. She moved to Washington, D.C. where she met Lilmond Barham, whom she married in 1946. From this union they conceived 8 children, one of which preceded her in death, Lilmond, Jr. She began her career in the U.S. Government, Bureau of Engraving and Printing. The Baltimore City Police Department later employed her as the Internal Revenue Service where she remained until her retirement. Jackie was a very active member of the Pinehurst Protective Association (Neighborhood Association). She was always willing to assist in any duties that needed to be done. Jacquelyn accepted Jesus Christ early in life and was baptized at Pond Street Baptist Church in Providence, RI, where she taught Sunday school. After relocating to Baltimore, she joined the St. Mark's Baptist Church before joining the Zion Baptist Church under Christian Experience. Jackie worshiped at Zion until her health no longer allowed her to attend. In March 2003, Jacquelyn was admitted to Keswick Multicare Facility due to a serious illness. On Wednesday, April 21, 2004, at 6:42 a.m. God called His faithful servant Home. In celebration of her life, she is survived by one sister, Barbara Hall Alston; four sons, Walter (Doris), Raymond, Kenneth, and Clarence; three daughters, Leslie Weems,

Karen Miller (Benjamin), and Pamela Gaskins (Gregory); two sisters-in-law, Mable Myrick (Timothy), and Lillian Barham; nine grandchildren, Shirley (Lance), Tammy, Monica, Isha (Anthony), Dionne (Kenneth), Erica, Donte', Alysia and Dominic; four great grandchildren, Raven, Malik, Cameron, Zachary, and a host of nieces, nephews and friends.
