James also served as a sheriff with the Calcasieu Parish Sheriff's Office. James was baptized at the Zion Baptist Church in Baltimore. He joined the Zion Tabernacle Baptist Church in Lake Charles on Christian experience and remained a faithful and loyal member until his death. He often remarked that the greatest thing he had done in his life was to reunite with the church. He derived great pleasure in retelling the many stories of his life and experiences. We will miss his laugh and the sparkle in his eyes, but we will never forget him.
