James Henry Clark, son of the late James T. and Julia Clark, was born on October 2, 1919 in Hudson, New Jersey. He slipped away to be with his Lord and Savior Jesus Christ on September 6, 2002. He received his education in the public schools of Wolf Trap, Virginia. At the age of twenty-one he enlisted in the United States Army a year before the attack on Pearl harbor. After leaving the military James worked at several jobs including construction laborer and teamster. He later found employment at the Bethlehem Steel Company's Sparrow Point plant where he worked until his retirement. In addition he graduated from the Apex Barber School and successfully completed numerous correspondence courses in the area of television and radio repair as well as an adult education course. On June 20, 1955 James was wed to the former Carrie Louise Copeland. God blessed their union with two sons, Rev. Reginald M. Clark and James T. Clark. The love and devotion of this marriage continued until the end. James accepted Christ as his savior at an early age.
