Following several months of declining health, he passed away peacefully Monday, November 3, 2008. Shortly after graduating from Carver Vocational High School, he went into the U.S. Army where he served in the U.S. Army's segregated 784th Tank Battalion from 1943 to 1945 which included action in the European Theater. Returning home from the war, he began a career with the federal government, first working at the Middle River depot and ending his 30 year career retiring from the Social Security Administration. In 1952 he married the late Vera Mae Reid. They enjoyed forty wonderful years together. From this union was born their daughter, Lynne. He is survived by his daughter Lynne and son-in-law, Ray, a granddaughter Morgan and a grandson Marcus, his cousin Dimples, his friend Julia, numerous nephews and nieces from the Reid family, and the surviving members of the U.S. Army's 784th Tank Battalion (www.784th.com).
