James Emanuel "Yobo" Hickman, Sr., left his family and friends on Sunday, September 3, 2017.

James was preceded in death by his wife, Yolanda Bodrick Hickman; father, Washington Alexander Hickman, Sr.; sister, Virginia "Skeeter" Hickman; brothers, Washington "Butch", Jr. and Rudolph "Rudy" A. Hickman; maternal grandparents, Ralph H. and Queenie Esther Hall and paternal grandparents, Phillip S. and Lillian Hickman.

James was the third child and second son born to the late Washington Hickman and Deaconess Virginia Hall Hickman. He took his first breath of life on January 15, 1949 here in Richmond, Virginia.

James attended Richmond Public Schools and was a 1967 graduate of Maggie L. Walker High School. While at Walker he participated in many activities among them a member of the Cadet Corps and FBLA (Future Business Leaders of America). Upon graduating he attended and completed Smithdale Massey Business School. James always had a "flair for dressing, so while still in high school he sought employment and worked in Standards

Drug Store at 1st and Marshall in the Shoe Repair Department so that he could "dress to impress".

Upon graduating he obtained employment with Consolidated Bank and Trust. Feeling a tugging on his heart for law enforcement he became a member of the City of Richmond's Police Department. He began as a foot-officer and excelled in every area of his police work, finally becoming a Homicide Detective. James retired from the Police Department after over 27 years of employment.

After retirement he did several jobs with security but found he really wanted to get back into the "real" world of policing and security and became employed with the Richmond Public Schools Department of Safety and Security where he reached the rank of Lieutenant prior to his retirement in July, 2016

He attended Moore Street Missionary Baptist Church with his father and brothers and other family members. He joined with the Fifth Street Baptist Church but was moved to be with his wife so that they might worship and work together for the Kingdom at Hood temple A.M.E. Zion Church. There he served as an usher, assisted Dr. McGill whenever and wherever needed, a steward and Chief of Security.

James married the late Yolanda "Dolly" Bodrick Hickman on July 23, 1988. He always referred to her as "My Pretty Lady." They enjoyed more than 35 years together as a couple until her homegoing in February, 2016. They truly loved each other deeply and had a special relationship. They enjoyed traveling, watching movies, going to church together and many other activities. Dolly was the true love of his life! Her departure to Heaven created a void that could not be filled!

James' smile could light up any room when he entered. He was "the life of the

party." He enjoyed fishing, playing cards, traveling and enjoying his favorite movie "Home Alone." If you ever had the opportunity to see his facebook page, you would also see that instead of being a Chef Garvin...or Madison Cowans, he was "Chef Jazzy J."
