JAMES LEE HUGHLEY, SR. was born November 6, 1925 to Zeola and Duffie Hughley in Vincent, Alabama. James was the oldest of two sons, James and Robert L. Hughley, and two daughters, Thelma and Zeola (Tina). They all preceded him in death. On August 18, 2006 at 8:15 p.m. at the Loch Raven Rehabilitation Center, James departed this life just as he lived — quietly and peacefully. James moved to Baltimore, Maryland at the age of ten. James was a very kind, gentle and friendly person. He was well liked by everyone that knew him. He enjoyed taking daily walks through the neighborhood, listening to hymns, and he loved playing the Lottery. James will be truly missed by all who knew him. He leaves to cherish his memory: his loving wife of fifty-eight years, Annabelle Hughley; two sons, James L. Hughley Jr. (Marbe) and Gregory Hughley; one daughter, Yvonne Jean Hughley; seven grandchildren, Yvonne, Tony, Dennis, Marbe (Boo), Candice (Missy), Anthony

(Man) and Gregory (Bunkey); nine great-grandchildren; two sisters-in-law, Esther McKinney and Martha Pendleton; a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, and other relatives and friends.
