JAMES DANIEL ISAAC was born on September 2, 1928 in Springfield, Orangeburg County, South Carolina. He was the eldest son of the late Luemisher Isaac Lawton and Lionel Hartwell. After a lengthy illness, he departed this life at 4:40 p.m., Thursday, July 20, 2006 at St. Agnes Hospital. James, better known as Ike, completed his education in Springfield, South Carolina. He later came to Baltimore in the early 1950's. He was employed at Regal Laundry and retired from Maryland Hospital laundry. Ike met and married Mary Ray in the summer of 1962. Out of this union they had three children; two daughters and one son (who preceded him in death). His grandchildren and great-grandchildren were dear to his heart.
