James Milton Dancy Sr., was born in Fayetteville, North Carolina on April 19, 1923 to the late Charles Dancy and Josephine McCaughlin. James Dancy Sr. departed this life on May 17, 2005. James Dancy Sr. was educated in the North Carolina Public School System. On July 8, 1941 at the age of eighteen he enrolled in the Civilian Conservation Corps in Raleigh, North Carolina as a laborer. He then moved to Baltimore, Md. to seek better employment. James Dancy joined the United States Army on September 7, 1945 until December 11, 1946. While in the service he married his sweetheart, the late Dunreath Cornish on February 2, 1946, in Baltimore, Maryland where they were married for fifty-three years. Out of this union came seven children. James Dancy's occupation was a certified first class welder for Bethlehem Steel. In his spare time, James Dancy Sr. enjoyed watching football, baseball and the horses. For recreation he joined several clubs where he played cards and partied. He retired from Bethlehem Steel in 1985. James Dancy Sr, affectionately called "Daddy" by his children and "Swishman" and "Grandpop" by his grand and great-grandchildren, loved spending time with his family. At mealtime he was famous for saying, "eat children eat." Two grandchildren preceded him in death, L'Tonya Williams and D'Koy Dancy.
