JAMES OTHO EWELL, son of the late Elise Rounds Ewell and the late James Meredith Ewell, was born on May 13, 1938 in Snow Hill, Maryland. He was called to eternal rest on Thursday, March 2, 2006 at his home in Joppa, Maryland. Otho received his formal education in the Worcester County Public School System. He graduated in 1956 from Worcester High School in Snow Hill, Maryland and he attended the University of Maryland Eastern Shore graduating in 1960 with a B.S. Degree and a member of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity. Otho enlisted in the Army of the United States and received an Honorable Discharge in July 1965 having served in the General Medic Division. After being discharged from the army, Otho continued his education and received a Master of Science Degree at Morgan State College (now University) in May, 1975. He taught in the public schools located in Maryland for several years, after which he worked as a Director for the Baltimore City Department of Recreation and Parks for 33 years, before his retirement in 1996.
