He was happy providing the free services even though he had to work late nights, many weekend hours, and on call days. He ran the clinic for several years. before migrating to United States of America (U.S.) in 1994.

S. determined to further his nursing education, he attended the University of Maryland – School of Nursing for his Masters of Science in Nursing – Mental Health Nursing (MSN) and he worked in Various health care facilities in the state of Maryland. He also co-founded Reliance Staffing Agency and Reliance Holdings, Inc.
