James Ollie Quarles was born on February 19, 1924 to the late Sallie R. and James O. Quarles in Henrico County, Virginia. He attended Enfield School in King William County, Va. and then received a diploma in brick masonry from the Maryland School of Building Trade in Baltimore, Md. As a young man he proudly served during World War II as a scout for the United States Army. He was employed by the Hanover School for Boys where in 1986 after approximately 25 years of service, he retired. He was a man who possessed many talents and skills among them farming and carpentry. He was also co-owner of a grocery store in Hanover, Va. He had three siblings: Freddie, Charles and Helen Quarles (all deceased). On October 14, 1944 he married Carrie E. Simms, a faithful and loving wife, who preceded him in death. From this union was born three children. On April 7, 1963 he became a member of the Refuge Temple of Our Lord Jesus Christ under the pastorate of the late Apostle John W. Pernell. Shortly thereafter, he was ordained a deacon. He served as the Chairman of the Deacon Board for several years at Refuge Assembly, Richmond, Va. He was the Chairman of the Trustee Board and the Superintendent of the Sunday School Department at Refuge Temple, King William County, VA. He leaves to cherish his memory one son, Douglas Quarles (Margie) and two daughters, (Joyce Gaston (Cleo) and Joanne Burrell: a sister, Deloris Latney: five grandsons: Michael (Tony), Andre, Brandon, Travis and Darien: three great-grandchildren: Brianna, Dequana, and Darrius: a sister-in-law, Lelia Woodbury (Bishop E.
