Deacon James Arthur Reddick, 72, of Mechanicsville, Virginia departed this life Monday, January 27, 2020. He was born May 9, 1947, the son of the late Walter Lee and Betty Sue Reddick in Leesburg, Georgia.

He graduated from the Leslie, Georgia Public School System. He enlisted into the United States Army and served his country well. In 1969, he received an

honorable discharge.

Over the life of his career, he was employed with the U.S. Postal Service and Drew University. His favorite position was as a dedicated truck driver with Wakefern Corporation for more than 20 years. He loved traveling from coast to coast in his tractor trailer and meeting people from all walks of life. His CB handle was Red Dragon.
