James R. Spriggs, II, son of the late James R. and Margaret Spriggs, was born on September 21, 1943, Baltimore, Maryland, the eldest of three children. He transitioned into Glory on November 17, 2011.

When he was in school, he was part of a group of students who were being trained to become future businessmen. He graduated from Baltimore City College (High School), then attended Morgan State College where he was a psychology major. He was a member of the Maryland Crime Investigating Committee, was an assistant scoutmaster and a member of the Arena Players Theatre Group.

He was active in the Civil Rights Movement of the 1960's, and served as Registrar for the Board of Election Supervisors and Judge of Election. He was a member of the Steering Committee for voter registration, and ran for representative to the House of Delegates from the Fifth District in Maryland. He later went to work for the Social Security Administration in Baltimore as a computer specialist.

James gave his life to Christ as a child, and later became a member of Mt. Calvary Episcopal Church. He rededicated his life to God as an older person. He enjoyed going to church services while he lived at Genesis Health Care Nursing Home where he spent the last few years of his life. He took pleasure

in singing and dancing and had a nice singing voice.

He is survived by: two birth sisters, Carolyn Brooks and Michele Spriggs-Johnson; his step-mother, Meriam Spriggs; three stepsisters, Lorna Allen (Terrell III), Denise Browning (Anthony) and Richelle Wilson; a host of cousins, nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.
