JAMES EDWARD STREET, affectionately known as Tootnie, was born on October 12, 1937 to the late Shelton and Nannie Street in Prince Edward County, Virginia. He departed his earthy life on November 20, 2020 at 10:13 p.m. at King David Rehabilitation Center. James was the only brother to three sisters; Tenner Louise Jackson preceded him in death. He accepted Christ at an early age and was baptized at High Rock Baptist Church under the leadership of Reverend Bradshaw. He was also educated in the Prince Edward County School System.

At the age of eighteen, he moved to Baltimore, Maryland, where he began work as a truck driver for Pariser's Bakery. He served a short time in the United States Army and was honorably discharged on March 31, 1964. Later, he gained employment at Spring Grove State Hospital from which he retired after twenty-five years of award-winning service. James was a man of faith and continued his spiritual journey at Community Baptist Church in Jessup, Maryland under the leadership of the late Reverend Robert T. Hurte.

James loved to cook and was a good at it. He loved to travel, often taking bus trips. Perhaps his happiest pastime was working with The American Legion of

Maryland, Post #285. He was a faithful member for many years and found enjoyment working with them. You could always find him at the "Post."

On November 15, 1963, he married Barbara Pettis and from this union, one daughter, Kimberly, was born. His marriage to Barbara ended in divorce and later he married Marie Street, who went home to be with the Lord in 2006.
