He was a member of St. Matthew Church, where he served in the Knights of Columbus and volunteered for the Daily Bread Kitchen, a local outreach program for the homeless. He loved his church and enjoyed attending bible study classes and going to confession. His pastor, Father Joe Muth, described James as a "generous and wise member, who was not afraid to face the struggles in his life." In his recovery, James enthusiastically shared his testimony and served as a witness to God's miraculous power. He is survived

by his “spiritual” wife, Adelpia Lucas, of Bloomfield, NJ; one daughter, Caryl Lucas, of Passaic Par, NJ; two sons, James Lucas, of New York, NY; Daryl Perry, and his wife, Yvonne, of Pembroke Pines, FL.
