JARIOUS "JEANO" POINDEXTER, the son of Martha Ann Poindexter Givens and the late Layton Edward Trice, was born on February 18, 1959 at Provident Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland. He left his earthly home on Sunday, March 25, 2012.

Jeano was raised by his grandmother, the late Velma Davis Poindexter McCree. Jeano received his early education in the Baltimore City Public School System and graduated from Patterson High School on June 9, 1977. After graduation, Jeano was employed by General Motors Corporation where he worked until the plant closed. Shortly after that, he found another job at a local meat packing company, working on the loading dock. It was during his employment with this company that he was injured in an accident that led to him being disabled and unable to work again.

Jeano will always be remembered as a person full of life and love and possessing a winning smile.

He leaves to cherish his memory: his devoted mother, Martha A. Givens; two brothers, Michael and Triemel Givens; one sister-in-law, Linda Givens; godparents, Ruth and George Nelson; one niece, three nephews, two great-aunts and three great-uncles; a host of other relatives and friends, including his two life-long buddies, Wendell and Justin.
