Jasper honorably served his country in the armed services from June 1943 to April 1946. In civilian life he distinguished himself as one of the first black members of the Baltimore City Fire Department. He started and ended his career with Truck Company #27 and was a member of the Vulcan Blazers. He started his firefighter career in 1955 until retiring in 1978. Jasper and his firefighter friends developed a kinship and were together to the end. Jasper made numerous friends wherever he went. Children were drawn to him and he took time to listen. He enjoyed traveling and being an amateur photographer. He absolutely loved gardening, fishing and crabbing. You could always find Jasper outdoors from morning to evening, hard at work.
