She enjoyed playing with her little brother Reggie, niece Kim and nephew David and card games such as War, Pity Pat, Rob the Bundle, Slap Jack and Old Maid. Jean was loved by all of her family, especially her aunt, Anita Hall, whom she loved dearly.

For the last fifteen years, Jean was a resident of Bluepoint Nursing Home, where she made numerous friends and enjoyed being in the dining room during, all of her waking hours. Her outgoing personality drew many of the

residents, staff and visitors to her. She was always willing to share her “goody bag” and piece of cake with others. She participated in various activities including Bingo, church services and at times led the exercise class. It was also well known that she would never hesitate to ask for “a dollar” from family, staff or visitors.

Jean was preceded in death by her father, Calvin, Sr.; her mother Mary, who devoted her life to Jean’s care; and her brother, Calvin Parker, Jr.
