Jeannette Davis (Née Langley), daughter of the late Mack Neil Green and Omega Langley, was born in St. James Santee, South Carolina on May 1, 1939. She departed this life quietly on Thursday, January 31, 2019 surrounded by her family.

Gail, as she was affectionately known, attended Russelville High School in Berkeley County, South Carolina.

Jeannette and her siblings were raised in a Christian home and fellowshiped with Wesley AME Church, where her class leader was Deacon Harold Padgett and pastoral leadership of Reverend Butler. Jeannette met the love her life, George Davis, and were married on February 14, 1959. From this union, three boys were born, George Jr., Clarence and Christopher. You would always see these five together at home and at family gatherings.

Church. Upon her husband's transition, she began attending Church of the Redeemed of the Lord until her health failed her.

You would always find her sitting on the porch in the late afternoon having vibrant conversations with her neighbors and passing friends. She was beloved in her community. Even friends of her children would stop by her house to sit and talk with her.

Uncle George and Aunt Gail, as they were so affectionately called, were loved by their nieces, nephews, great nieces and nephews, family, and friends for their fatherly and motherly affections toward them.
