We attended elementary, junior high, and high school together and played football together in high school (Go Panthers!). We parted ways after high school but stayed in touch over the years.*

*I have many fond memories of Jeff but there is one memory that stands out the most. Here is the story: One Friday night following a dance/party held at Westwood High, Jeff, Tony Bates, myself, and a few more guys that attended Westwood with us were approached by these guys from Vero Beach. One of the guys were on the Vero Beach High School football team and he remembered me from the game. I remembered him too because we had a very competitive game and he used a lot of profanity during the game and he told he was going handle me after the game. I don’t worry too much about his comment because we rarely have contact with the opposing teams after the games.*

*But that night after the dance he showed up apparently ready to pick a fight with someone. He spotted me and he immediately started cursing at me, but I ignored him. To make a long story short, that guy approached me from behind with every intention to hurt me. So when I turned to defend myself, Jeff was there to protect me. He had grab the guy’s arm to stop him from hitting me. I remember seeing guy’s arm up in the air as Jeff grab him and I remember Jeff telling guy “not tonight buddy”. Then Jeff told me to get in the car and go home. I will never forget that moment and any of the other memories we shared.*
