Jennie Mae Green was born the third of five children, of Lloyd Marshall Green and Daisy Washington Green on December 24, 1924 in Baltimore, Maryland. Church and she was a faithful member of Christ Edmondson United Methodist Church. For over twenty-five years, she was member of Bethel A.M.E. Church. She culminated her working career at the B & O Railroad Museum, where she proudly served as a receptionist, who was faithful to
