April 1, 1980 - February 8, 2013

JENNIFER NICOLE CONYERS – in her words, the “fabulous” one – was born on April 1, 1980 in Baltimore, Maryland. She came into this world with clenched fists and she was a fighter throughout life. She would always define her goals and then go after them.

The daughter of Harry Anthony and Alverta Elzine Moore Conyers was educated in the Baltimore City Public School System and was proud to be a graduate of the 1998 class of Western High School. She loved to show others she was a dove, and she liked wearing her Western jacket and her class ring. She earned her bachelor’s degree at Coppin State University in 2002 and went on to get her master’s at the University of Baltimore in 2006. She was initially employed at Associated Black Charities as part of the Ryan White program. That program was eventually taken over by the Baltimore City Health Department.

Jennifer was a young lady of many talents and interests. A skilled jewelry maker, she crafted pieces that caught the eye of family members, co-workers and others. She would sell her jewelry at the annual Christmas bazaar at her church, Sharp Street Memorial United Methodist Church. She also loved to design items made from her Yudu machine, which featured screen prints. T-shirts, shawls and hoodies all were enhanced by her creative efforts. She was the family photographer and relatives eagerly awaited her annual 12 Days of

Christmas photo gifts. Each day she offered e-mailed collages of photos from various Moore family events.

She was a music lover and especially enjoyed the performances of her Uncle David's music group called "The Stepbrothers." Often you could see her taking videos and pictures of various performances. If she could make it, she would be right there, supporting her uncle and his friends.

She had a wonderful relationship with her family and visited the houses of family members. She had a unique sense of humor and didn't mind teasing her parents, calling them "The Olds." She would often say that her mother's driving was "so slow that a turtle on roller skates" could pass her. She loved to quote her father who, when she was in high school, often characterized her, with love, as "one bratty daughter." She, in turn, would say, "They are not my parents," if she thought their actions were quirky or goofy.

Jennifer would visit her parents multiple times a week, and she and her parents definitely enjoyed a close relationship. She even purchased a home six months ago that was only blocks from her parents' residence.

She was the last in the line of Moore cousins, No. 18. And she was the last undergraduate to shake the hand of Coppin's outgoing president, Dr. Calvin W. Burnett in 2002.

She leaves to mourn her passing: her parents, Harry and Alverta Conyers; her godparents, Ann Drake and Cleveland Conyers; and the rest of a large, close Christian family.
