Jerlene A. Boyd was born on January 20, 1939 in Baltimore, Maryland to the late Helen L. Wooden and Leroy A. Wooden, Sr. She departed this life on September 26, 2022 after a brief illness.

Aunt Jerl, as she was lovingly known to her friends and family, was educated in the Baltimore City Public School System. Jerlene was employed by the Department of Social Services for over 25 years. She received many awards and citations from DSS and the City of Baltimore.

Jerlene was united in marriage to Norman Boyd, Jr. on June 10, 1977.

Jerlene worked tirelessly to support her family, friends, and the Boyd-Booth community. For 15 years, Jerlene fought to get a park dedicated to a firefighter cadet that lost her life during a training exercise in the Boyd-Booth community. The Racheal M. Wilson Memorial Park and Playground opened April 2022. Jerlene also fought hard to keep the Payson St. Library open for the community. The library is now the Community Resource Center with the computer lounge named the Jerlene Boyd Computer Lab.

Jerlene served in many organizations: the Boyd-Booth Community Association, the Grace Medical Center, formally Bon Secours Silver Seniors, and Bon Secours Community Works.

However, her greatest joy was being a wife and mother. She always supported her children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren in any endeavors they chose to pursue and guided them in the right directions.

She loved attending family functions, dancing, watching Law and Order, and going to Atlantic City.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Norman Jr.; son, Anthony; and brother, Leroy.

Jerlene leaves to cherish her memories; four daughters, Robin, Donna, Rynice (Andre), and Jacqueline; one son, Norman (Evelyn); grandchildren, great-grandchildren, great-great grandchildren; goddaughter, Sharay; godson, Antonio; sister, Pandora (Bert); sister-in-law, Rocksann (John); and a host of family and friends.
