JEROME HALL, affectionately known to his family and friends as “Andrew” was born on July 24, 1930 in Baltimore, Maryland to Robert and Lillian (nee Allen) Hall. He departed this earthly Tabernacle on October 23, 2010.

Jerome received his formal education in the Baltimore City Public School System, graduating from the Paul Laurence Dunbar Senior High School. He furthered his education during his career in the United States Army.

Mr. Hall joined Waters African Methodist Episcopal Church under the pastorate of Reverend Doctor Ronald E. Braxton. He was a member of the Brotherhood; the Male Chorus, the Mass Choir, the Lay Organization and served on the Board of Trustees for many years. Jerome also served on the Food Co-Op Committee. Mr. Hall made himself available at the church almost on a daily basis, to do anything that needed to be done. He was referred to by his fellow churchmen as the “Sergeant-At-Arms” of Waters Church. He was sure to be found guarding the front door from his special seat in his chosen place on any Sunday that he was present at church.

Jerome entered the United States Armed Forces in the early 1950's, serving in the United States Army for a total of twenty-six years, ten months and twelve days. He served in the Korean War and the Vietnam War where he was the recipient of many decorations and medals. He achieved the highest rank that

is bestowed upon an enlisted serviceman- the rank of Sergeant Major. He received the following medals: Good Conduct Medal w/Silver Clasp, Bronze Star Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, National Defense Service Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Presidential Unit citation, Army Occupation Medal, Air Medal, Vietnam Gallantry Cross W/Palm, Vietnam Service Medal, Vietnam Campaign Medal, Combat Medical Badge, Master Parachute Badge, Expert Infantryman Badge, Sharpshooter Badge rifle M-14 and M-16.

Andrew was a member of the 9th and 10h Horse Calvary of the Buffalo Soldiers, Baltimore Chapter. He actively participated in the functions and traveled all over the country to be a part of activities in other states.

Though quiet in nature as well as soft spoken, Andrew was a very kind, caring, compassionate and generous person. He was well respected and loved by his family, friends and fellow "Soldiers." Andrew was an avid sports fan.

Memories of Andrew will be cherished by: his daughter, Darlene Hall; his grandchildren, Antonine, Towanda and Jeffery; thirteen great-grandchildren; his brother, David Kaintuck; his loving sister, Essie Kaintuck; special cousins, John Fowler and Larry Blanton; a host of other cousins, nieces and nephews, all of Baltimore, Maryland; also an adopted brother and sister, Wilbur and Bernice Jennings of Atlanta, George; and a lifetime special friend, Beatrice Phoenix.
