Jerome Edward Winn, born on July 27, 1948, the second son of the late Earl Floyd Winn and Clara Randolph Winn of Richmond, Virginia. He quietly passed away on Friday, May 4, 2018.

Jerome attended Cedar Street Baptist Church and sang in the male chorus.

He graduated from Armstrong High School in June 1966. After graduation, he enlisted into the United States Navy. He was discharged on January 19, 1970 where he received an honorable discharge with the rank of E-2; 2nd class seaman.

Jerome attended Virginia Commonwealth University for three years as an art major. He was formally married to Linda Gail Jenkins Winn from 1981 until 2015.

He was hired at the Richmond Tribune becoming the first African-American to work in the art department, where he worked for twelve years and won five

state awards.

After entering several talent shows at Virginia Commonwealth University, he began to perform in comedy clubs around the country. He has performed in many comedy shows and made appearances in several television shows including Boston Public, Boston Legal, Glee and Crazy Ex-Girlfriend. In his leisure he enjoyed drawing, football, and classic movies.

He is survived by his daughters Bridget, Phinon and Jasmine; older brother, Earl Winn and younger brother, Tony Winn; a host of other relatives and friends.
