Jessie was a domestic worker since the age of six years old when she helped her parents around the family's farm. Jessie's natural ability of care giving began when she helped to raise her siblings. Jessie's custodian engineering career began in South Carolina and continued when she moved to Baltimore, Maryland. She worked for many different families such as Mr. and Mrs. Taylor, Bob and Jim, Ms. Mary, and Ms. Sydell; relationships were forged during those years of service. Jessie became their family member, friend and confidant. She helped to raise their children as her very own. The Brown family is forever grateful to Mr. and Mrs. Taylor and family, Jim and Bob for their limitless support during the last hours of our beloved Jessie B. Brown. Anyone who knew Jessie Brown of 2314 West Baltimore Street knew that on every Sunday afternoon you could stop by and feast on her good down home cooking. Jessie was a

mild-mannered person until you messed with her boys, Mud, Michael, Be-Be, and Maurice. She kept things in perspective, spoke her mind, was not afraid to put a young person in their place and handled her business. She leaves to mourn: her only son, James W. Brown (Mudhole); sisters, Annie M.
