EVANGELIST JESSIE LEE POWELL, (Jessie Mae) daughter of the Late Eugene A. Leake and Annie Underhill Leake, was born on February 23, 1944 in Green County, North Carolina.. "A wonderful change came over her" on December 21, 2005, as she entered into eternal rest. Missionary Jessie Powell, Mother Powell, Mrs. Powell, Ma Powell, Aunt Jessie, Momma, and Jessie Mae, are just a few of the names that honored this wonderful woman. Jessie was a God-fearing, powerhouse disciple for the Lord. She praised God everywhere she went. Coming from a very loving, Christian Family; Jessie was a great daughter to her parents, sister to her siblings, devoted Wife to her husband, Mother to her children and Grandmother to her grandchildren and great-grandchildren. Jessie was certain to take time to patiently nurture, guide, teach, preach to, and discipline her family. These teachings were shared with all whom she encountered. Jessie grew up in Edgecombe County, North Carolina where she attended Bellamy Elementary School, Phillip Junior High, and George Washington Carver High School. Jessie gave her life to Christ at an early age, and continued to follow wherever he led her throughout her life. She was a member of St. Stephens Free Will Baptist Church, in Rocky Mount, North Carolina. This was proven by her twenty-three years of devoted instruction, care, and guidance to the students, faculty, and parents in the Baltimore City Public School System at Lafayette Elementary School #202.
