John Baxter, son of the late Artimus and Lugenia Baxter, was born October 13, 1919 in St. Matthews, South Carolina. God called him home to eternal rest on Tuesday, December 21, 2004, after a lengthy illness. John loved his home and family and was blessed to spend his final days at home surrounded by family. John received his early education in the schools of St. Matthews. His love of farming led him to the State Agricultural and Mechanical College in Orangeburg, South Carolina where he began studies that would prepare him to teach agriculture. In April 1942, he answered his country's call to military service when he was drafted by the United States Army. John served his country well, receiving six citations and decorations, including the Bronze Star for his "exemplary and meritorious" service. Deferring his own desire to return home and complete his education, John extended his military service so that he could support his younger siblings after their parents' deaths.

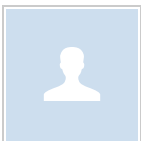
